

## Mental Health Services to Children and Families

### A. Innovative Services Section

a. Children's Trauma Initiative – Mary Ludtke

- Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy
- Child Parent Psychotherapy

*The Children's Trauma Initiative is beginning Cohort 27 of TF-CBT and Resource Parent Training in October. This learning collaborative as well as Cohort 26 are being facilitated virtually. Child Parent Psychotherapy learning collaborative (#2) will end in December. Data is gathered to ensure outcomes are achieved during the implementation of the models.*

b. Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Initiative (FY20)—K. Fitzpatrick

c. SED/NDD—Families Moving Forward and Children's Friendship Training (FY21)-- K. Fitzpatrick

*Training in Families moving Forward will take place in March/April 2021 for an additional 3-4 CMHSPs. Training is taking place currently to have Michigan trainers for Families Moving Forward (EBP). The Children's Friendship Training will take place in the summer of 2021.*

d. Motivational Interviewing for Adolescents (FY21)-- K. Fitzpatrick

*Clinicians/supervisors will be trained in MI for adolescents and coaching calls will begin in October.*

e. Parent Management Training-Oregon (PMTO) and Parenting Through Change (PTC);

Parenting Through Change – Reunification (PTC-R)—Luann Gray/Mary Ludtke

*Luann Gray shared that PMTO and PCT trainings have moved to virtual training. Manuals for training has been modified for the virtual format. Launched the MI Parenting Resource on the PMTO website. A flyer is being provide to PISC.*

f. DBT for Adolescents (FY21) – Mary Ludtke/Erica Szafranski, PhD

*A learning collaborative for DBT for adolescents with focus on suicidal ideation, self-harm reduction. CMHSPs will be able to apply for the collaborative. Teams applying can range from 4-8 people. Applications will go out in October with specifics on training. Informational call on October*

g. Infant Mental Health Home Visiting – Evaluation outcomes--Mary Ludtke

*The Infant Mental Health Home Visiting evaluation is concluding. The RCT is concluding their 1 year follow up evaluations. Data is being analyzed. Several articles have been drafted. We will present information later regarding the outcomes of the RCT/ quasi-experimental studies.*

h. Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation in Childcare Settings—Mary Ludtke

*The Consultants are reaching out to childcare providers providing “disaster” child care for frontline workers, provided training video for providers on importance of social emotional health of young children they serve. In addition to continuing to work with childcare providers that have remained open during the pandemic to build their skills in developing the social emotional well-being of young children and address challenging behaviors of specific children in care.*

i. Measuring Outcomes for Children and Families—CAFAS, PECFAS, DECA—Mary Ludtke  
*CAFAS and PECFAS training of trainers as well as trainer boosters are being held virtually this year. Trainers can register via CMHAM.*

*We have offered a webinar on scoring the school sub-scale on the CAFAS/PECFAS during the pandemic. If someone wants the link for the webinar, please contact [Ludtkem@michigan.gov](mailto:Ludtkem@michigan.gov).*

*Outcomes for children, pre-post via CAFAS and PECFAS continues to be in the clinically significant range, per our annual data analysis.*
