### Office of Recovery Oriented Systems of Care (OROSC) – Angie Smith-Butterwick

- A. Prevention and Treatment Section – Angie went over new grant information
  - Pregnant and Parenting Women (PPW-PLT) – 2 new pilot grant programs
    - ✓ Mom Power – If approved, they would like to tie that one in with services for families to their opioid home health model
    - ✓ Fraternal of Fathers – for fathers involved and for families in need of medical and substance abuse disorder treatment
  - Center for Substance Abuse Treatment – New Prescription Drug Overdose grant for training first responders and others in the community on the administration of the Narcan
  - Prevention Network – a few mini grants on installing Narcan boxes for Calhoun, Genesee, and Wayne counties due to high SUD reports
    - ✓ Installation in jail waiting rooms
    - ✓ Motel strips
  - Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) Grant – will be submitting them in conjunction with the LATSE
    - ✓ Primary Care and Underage Drinking
    - ✓ She is hoping for some child adolescent health centers will be implementing SBIRT
  - Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) – Implementing peer mentoring for youth with a SUD program to curb juvenile delinquency and diversion
    - ✓ She is hoping to hear that with current high school recovery projects, so juveniles are not ending up in the court system but are instead in treatment
