a. <u>Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)</u> – Brenda Stoneburner The ACT and IDDT MIFAST visits are still on hold however if you need any technical assistance or support to reach out via email to <u>MDHHS-</u><u>MIFAST@michigan.gov</u>

b. <u>Behavior Supports</u> – Price Pullins No update given

c. <u>Co-occurring Disorders (COD)</u> – Michelle Boudreaux Michelle stated they have started their COD trainings mostly related to IDDT which can include individual's on IDDT teams, agency's that want to start IDDT teams, or if they have ACT/IDDT

- i. This week they have their IDDT 101, and March 7 and 9 is the Advance Assessments and Motivational Interventions
  - a. All the trainings are posted at <u>Community Mental Health</u> <u>Association of Michigan (CMHAM)</u>
- ii. They have 6 8 trainers currently develop new trainings for IDDT to support the ongoing education and current topics and trends that are coming up
  - a. If there are certain areas that you would like covered in those trainings to reach out to Michelle at <u>BoudreauxB@michigan.gov</u>
  - b. The department's goal is to have quarterly trainings so people can sign up for on a regular basis for new people coming in and an annual refresher
- d. <u>Deaf Blind and Hard of Hearing (DBHH)</u> Charlyss Ray Charlyss (MDHHS) and Dillon (DEAF C.A.N.!) did a presentation for My Health Link on deaf culture but they also looked at concerns for DBHH related to healthcare and the challenges that occur in their life
- e. <u>Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT)</u> Michelle Boudreaux The department also has DBT Foundational training with Behavioral Tech for trainers on April 13 and 14, 18,19,20 will be their first series and it will be offered again in May and August
  - i. It is lengthy on the registration

- f. <u>Family Psychoeducation (FPE)</u> Brenda Stoneburner Brenda indicated FPE is moving forward in terms of trainings scheduled and dates set more for agencies, but the statewide trainings will be coming up as well
- g. <u>Improving MI Practices (IMP) www.improvingMIpractices.org</u> Brenda Stoneburner

- i. The department is looking at getting additional courses up on IMP with some on COD, and other areas that have been identified as important areas and encourages everyone to look at the site

- h. <u>Level of Care Utilization System (LOCUS)</u> Jean Pfaendtner Jean said they are continuing to do virtual MIFAST reviews
  - i. Train-the-Trainer LOCUS cohort which started back in November
  - ii. They have participation from all PIHPs with 42 enrollees with about 30-35 in attendance the first Friday of the cohort meetings which consist of new and existing LOCUS trainers
  - iii. Every month they cover a new topic on how to train the LOCUS and it is going very well
- i. <u>Motivational Interviewing (MI)</u> Michelle Boudreaux The Motivational College is also provided on a quarterly basis for adults with a serious mental illness (SMI) and/or COD: MI Basic, MI Advanced for Supervisors, and MI for Leadership and Organizations
  - with the next training coming up in April and then July
    - i. They are in the process of developing a MI Train-the Trainer
    - ii. There is a training coming out on how to use MI in conjunction with other EBPs
    - iii. There are also MI courses on Improving MI Practices and there has been recent changes to those courses and when registering you may be asked if you live in Michigan, which are free to residents however other states there may be a charge to take the courses
- j. <u>Psychosocial Rehabilitation</u> Marty Alward No update
- <u>Services to Older Adults (OA)</u> Charlyss Ray Charlyss will be attending the 2022 American Deafness and Rehabilitation Association (ADARA) Conference on March 13 - 17

- I. <u>Individual Placement and Supports/Supported Employment</u> Joe Longcor
  - i. <u>IPS Report -</u> The FY 21 Evidence-Based Practice Individual Placement and Support (IPS) Report is completed and post on the MDHHS BHDDA Spotlight page at <u>MDHHS - FY 21 IPS</u> <u>Report</u> link
    - 1. It was a successful year even though we faced COVID last year
    - The first quarter data for FY22, they hit the highest employment rate since they have been collecting the data of the last 4 to 4 ½ years - it was over 44%
    - 3. Compared to other numbers in the CMHSP reports for SMI which ranges anywhere from 17-18% when not using the IPS model
  - ii. IPS International Learning Community Conference
    - 1. Joe is pleased to be part of the International Learning Community since 2017
    - 2. The conference will be held May 3 4, 2022 by invitation only
    - 3. They selected Michigan this year to host the event in Detroit
    - 4. The conference will have 22 25 states and perhaps 6 countries join us
  - iii. Dispelling Benefits-To-Work Myths with Tracy Howard
    - 1. Joe also mentioned a free training that is not an EBP but a useful tool "Dispelling Benefits-To-Work Myths", for the following date:

  - iv. IPS and Motivational Training
    - Michelle and Joe will be developing a new training for employment specialists for MI and IPS so that will be coming up soon
- m. <u>Trauma MIFAST and Prolonged Exposure</u> Michelle Boudreaux Late spring to summer there will be a Prolonged Exposure training which will focus on individuals with COD and one on Prolonged Exposure and DBT
  - i. They are still waiting for the DBT/PE manual to come out and that one will be for individuals who are using DBT services
